Please note that it can take six weeks to receive a Police Vet back. We will need you to drop off the paperwork and have TWO forms of identification (one photographic) to take the vetting application (Reception opens at 8:15am and closes at 4:00pm). 
If you don't have internet access, school office staff can provide you with printed copies of the policy and a review form.



Dear Parents/Caregivers,

This is to inform you that Kerikeri Oral Health Clinic (123 Hone Heke Road, Kerikeri) has become one of several teaching facilities for AUT Oral Health Therapist Students within Te Tai Tokerau.

Patients seen at this clinic may be examined and treated by Oral Health Students supervised by a DCNZ (Dental Council of New Zealand) registered Oral Health or Dental Therapist.

You will need to give verbal consent when booking the appointment, and written consent will be obtained at the examination appointment. Appointments may take longer depending on what treatment is required.

If you are unwilling to have your child treated by a student we will rebook your child, however, please be aware there may be a delay in receiving an appointment time and this may be at another clinic.
