We were due to have a new class delivered and implemented for this term. Unfortunately, this has not arrived. We have a hui this coming week and hope to have some indication of when we can expect it.

→ Jibbitz:

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★ These are the many and varied little extras that can be clipped onto Croc shoes, and many are ★ being worn to school. There is no rule about these, but parents need to be aware that there is still ★ a bit of an underground economy around the country (and inside our school) with bartering, ★ swapping, and even stealing of these jibbitz. I strongly recommend that you keep your child's ★ jibbitz at home on school days. Tracking down lost or stolen jibbitz among 435 children is almost ★ impossible, and I have instructed staff that this is not our core business and not to waste time and ★ energy trying to find them. The only sure way for your child not to lose them or have them stolen ★ is not to bring them to school.

Our Board of Trustees has the opportunity to view changes/additions and comment on them before they are implemented. We will advise you when policies are up for review and how you can take part in the review.

Build connections: They are eager to meet fellow parents, whanau, teachers, and staff who share their commitment to our school.


Make a difference: They are ready to roll up their sleeves and get involved by creating some cool events for our school.

Kia Ora, we are a group of year 13 girls (Greer, Paige, Lily and Holly) from Te Kura Tuarua o Te Kamo in Northland. As a part of our business class we joined the Young Enterprise Scheme where you have to design a product or service that helps solve a problem, in our case the lack of interactive Māori learning resources available in our kura. We have created an interactive Māori learning resource for both teachers and whanau alike. This resource is a Māori colouring in book based on the purakau Tāne separates Ranginui and Papatūānuku.



Our colouring in book:

- Retells the purakau Tāne separates Ranginui and Papatūānuku while providing the colouring illustrations to match
- Has completely original illustrations, drawn by Lily and Paige in collaboration with an internationally recognised Māori artist Matua Mel Wayne Edwards
- Has been translated using Te Tai Tokerau dialect in Te Reo Māori and following the Te Reo First Strategy, features English translations below.
- Has perforations so pages can be removed and made into wall mural or can be used as a hand out for class activities.
- Is Spiral binded with sturdy cover and backing.

This book is a great option for people above the age of 3 looking to learn and interact with New Zealand's Māori history. We price our book at \$25 so that it can be affordable for both teachers and whanau.
