Riverview School Out-of-Zone Enrolments for 2025

The Board of Trustees invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Riverview School for next year.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school website.

Please download the enrolment form off the school website www.riverview.school.nz and email to admin@riverview.school.nz with relevant documentation.

The deadline for receipt of applications for out-of-zone places is **Tuesday 15 October 2024.**

Parents of students who live within the home zone should also apply by this date to assist the school to plan appropriately for next year.

The board has determined that 1 place is likely to be available for out-of-zone new entrant students for 2025. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

If the number of out-of-zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on **Wednesday 23 October 2024**. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.





Trip Information

WEDNESDAY 2 OCTOBER - EEL FISHING ALONG THE WAIPAPA RIVER - We will depart school at 09.45am, taking a gentle stroll down to Waipapa Landing for our morning tea. With full bellies, we'll hunt eels hiding in the shadows of the river (no hooks used). As we're all ecowarriors, we'll return any caught eels to their watery home! Everyone will meet up at Waipapa Landing for lunch and a play by the river, before walking back to school. We should be back at school by 2.00pm. Children will need walking shoes and a warm layer of clothing. Please pack a large, healthy lunch and a water bottle. This trip is subject to safe

FRIDAY 4 OCTOBER - OPITO BAY - Leaving school 9.45am, we will take a bus to Opito Bay. After our morning tea we will take a walk through the AkeAke reserve to the viewpoint overlooking the Bay of Islands. Back on the beach we will complete a scavenger hunt, build sandcastles & collect shells for our art projects. The bus will bring us back to school for 1pm. Children will need shoes, sunhats, and clothing suitable for time in the sun, lunch, and a water bottle. This trip is dependent on good weather.

WEDNESDAY 4 OCTOBER - WAIROA STREAM WALK - At 9.45am, beginning at school, we will walk down the hill to the Stone Store Reserve. After morning tea, we will begin the Wairoa Stream walk, following the track alongside the stream, passing one waterfall, and stopping for lunch at the second larger waterfall. After lunch, we will complete the walk, ending on Cobham Rd (by the bridge opposite The Merchants). Here, the bus will collect everyone, for a well-deserved bus ride back to school. We will have plenty of rest stops along the way. Children will need walking shoes, sun hat, and a warm layer of clothing. Please pack a large, healthy lunch and a water bottle. This trip is subject to safe water levels and good weather conditions.

FRIDAY 11 OCTOBER - IN-LINE SKATING AT THE WAIPAPA

STADIUM - Leaving OSCAR at **09.45am**, we'll have a couple of hours at the Bay Sports Stadium in Waipapa, using in-line skates from the Kerikeri Inline Skating Club. There is a sprung floor and a beginners' area, so helmets are not usually needed. Children will be hungry by the time we get back for lunch. **Children will need LONG**, **THICK SOCKS** and something warm to wear afterwards. The bus will collect us at 12midday, returning to OSCAR for lunch.
